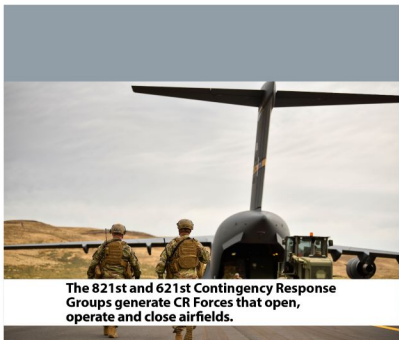




The 621st Mobility Support Operations Squadron Air Mobility Liaison Officers (AMLOs) advise and liaise with U.S. Army and Marine Corps units.

CR Forces Request Process for Contingencies

1. GCC initiates planning and contacts USTC J3
2. USTC Components and GCC components coordinate requirement
3. GCC submits request to USTC J3 via AMHS, email or VOVO with:
 - a. Location
 - b. Timeline (duration & in-place date)
 - c. Operational environment & requirement

The 621st Contingency Response Wing is a unique, worldwide deployable organization whose forces are primarily stationed at both Joint Base McGuire-Dix-Lakehurst, N.J. and Travis Air Force Base, Calif. The 621 CRW consists of approximately 1,500 Airmen assigned to three groups: 11 squadrons and more than 20 geographically separated operating locations aligned with major Army and Marine Corps combat units.

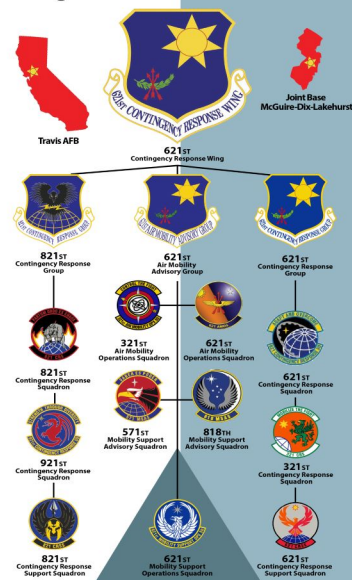
